

4611 North Lincoln Krause Music Store Exterior Restoration

Recipients: Peter and Pooja Vukosavich

The elaborate terra-cotta façade of the Krause Music Store was designed by famed architect Louis Sullivan, who was asked to collaborate on the design by his former employee, William Presto. The façade design was Sullivan's last project, and its extensively intricate, decorative ornament is indicative of his uniquely characteristic work. The current owner purchased the building and restored the terra cotta facade, the storefronts, and the upper-floor leaded windows as part of an overall rehabilitation of the building. The Krause Music Store was designated a Chicago Landmark on September 28, 1977.
